

Hear For You and the NDIS

A guide for parents and teenagers regarding NDIS funding for Hear For You Programs

What is the NDIS?

Launched in July 2016, the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) is a new way of providing support for people with disabilities. Implemented by the National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA), the scheme has meant big changes for people with a disability, their families and carers.

Now, people with disabilities are able to work with the NDIA to develop a support plan that's tailored to their needs. As part of this plan, people with disabilities can get NDIS funding for specific types of supports – meaning they have more say over what supports they receive, and which accredited providers why work with. One of the key advantages of the NDIA is that individuals have more power and control over their lives, and receive the support they need to achieve their goals. Is Hear For You an accredited NDIS provider?

Yes, Hear For You is a fully accredited NDIS provider in all Australian States and Territories. In 2019, we aim to host programs in Brisbane, Canberra, Sydney, Melbourne, and in selected NDIS areas of Rural and Regional NSW, QLD, and Victoria.

How can I best state my case for funding (to cover Hear For You programs and workshops) when applying to the NDIS?

While we can't guarantee you will receive NDIS funding to cover Hear For You workshops, when you apply, do so by requesting funding under these following support **two clusters**.

Is NDIS the only way I can pay for Hear For You programs or workshops?

There are three ways you can pay for our programs and workshops.

Option 1: You can pay for the activity yourself, upfront.

Option 2: If you have NDIS funding, you may be able to pay for the program or workshop through your plan. To do this, you'll need to buy an NDIS Participant ticket to the program or workshop of your choice via <u>Eventbrite</u> and fill in the required information we need regarding your NDIS Plan. e.g. your NDIS number and whether you're NDIA Agency managed, Plan Managed, or Self-Managed. Option 3:, if you are going through financial hardship you can apply to be part of our Community Fundraising Program, where we will work with you to fundraise through your local community clubs (RSLs, Rotary, Lions, Apex, etc.) To find out more about this option, please email us.

How many NDIS hours will I use with Hear For You?

★ Life Goals and Skills (Metro) Program

Number of NDIS Hours Required: 30

This is our flagship mentoring program, which focuses on bringing together deaf and hard of hearing teenagers with inspiring mentors who have 'been there, done that'. Together we explore different aspects of life, giving you then chance to exchange ideas and experiences with people who will actually understand. Our mentors have loads of life experience to share, which may just help clarify things in your own life. <u>Click here for more information</u>.

★ Life Goals and Skills (Blast) Program

Number of NDIS Hours Required: 16

Just like our flagship mentoring workshop, this two-day 'blast' focuses on connecting deaf and hard of hearing teenagers with inspiring mentors who have loads of stories to share. Over two days, we explore different aspects of living as a deaf teenager, giving you the chance to exchange ideas and experiences with people who just 'get it'. ★ Primary2Secondary Workshop

Number of NDIS Hours Required: 1.5 (Year 6 Session) Number of NDIS Hours Required: 3 (Year 7 Session)

Number of NDIS Hours Required: 4-16
